Greetings Immanuel Families,

I wanted to take the time to introduce myself. My name is Joanna Czubernat, my son Jacob is a 2nd grade student at Immanuel. I began working in the Extended Care during the second week of school with Mrs. Washington. During that time, I became familiar with the students by assisting in playtime, as well as providing snack and homework guidance.

In Mrs. Washington's stead, I was offered and gladly accepted the roll of Director of Extended Care. I have discussed with Mrs. Hahn some changes that I feel would be beneficial to the student's emotional and physical needs and would like to update you on some of those changes.

When the children enter extended care, they are excited and in need of playtime. Free play and crafts will be encouraged during the first hour of extended care, followed by snack and then homework assistance. If time allows, the students will be allowed computer time or we will enjoy a planned game or activity. If you have specific homework needs, please feel free to address them with the staff and we will adjust a student's daily schedule to ensure homework is started and in most cases finished.

The extended care will be following the school's health guidelines in terms of snack and physical fitness. The students will be offered only 100% juice, milk or water to drink; snacks offered will be made from whole grains, fruit or they will be allowed to finish what is in their lunch bags if they so desire. Weather permitting, each child will participate in basketball or be free to run and play outside. We have been offered the gym on bad weather days and the children are looking forward to games and activities that are difficult to organize in the classroom.

Also, we would like to incorporate behavior management in the extended care classroom. The children are slowly getting accustomed to how the rules of Immanuel are extended to aftercare. To eliminate issues, please go over the school handbook with them and encourage them to continue good manners when in aftercare. We are planning on initiating a monthly reward party to celebrate Christian behavior. Some ideas would be "cupcake day", a pizza party or the purchase of a game or toy for the classroom. We are aware of food allergies and a yummy substitute would be offered.

Finally, Extended Care is happy to have a new assistant, Mrs. Campbell. Mrs. Campbell's daughter Taisha is a 7th grade student at Immanuel; she also has 3 year old twins. Not only does this help qualify her to work well with children of all ages, but she has volunteered in the classroom before. I have seen her gladly help the children with homework and play a mean game of basketball with kids outside. She is friendly, even spirited and always wearing a smile. Mrs. Campbell and I get along well and it means so much to the kids to see that she and I are both on board to provide a loving, fun and educational stop for the children before going home.

I would like to thank Mrs. Hahn and the staff for their assistance in making the transition a pleasant one, with their offerings of toys, equipment and physical help.

If you have any questions or concerns, please visit Mrs. Campbell or myself. We appreciate any advice you may have and will work with you concerning any issues you have to address.

From the Principal's Desk

On October 31 we celebrate an important day in the Lutheran Church--Reformation Day. This day marks the beginnings of the Lutheran Church.

How did it happen? In 1517 a German monk named Martin Luther, was concerned about the teaching of the Roman Catholic Church. He was convinced that some of what the church was teaching was wrong! He searched the Bible for God's truth. He came up with 95 thesis (statements) dealing with the misconceptions. He wanted to stimulate discussion of these ideas so he posted them on the church doors in Wittenburg. It was the eve of All Saints Day so people would be sure to read the statements when they arrived at services.

Read them, they did. Printed copies were made and distributed (thanks to the invention of the printing press). The church officials were very upset about Martin Luther's statements. Luther was ordered by the Pope to appear before the church officials to recant (take back) his statements. They were not willing to discuss anything! Luther told the officials that he could not recant unless they could use the Bible to show him the error of his ways. He was excommunicated from the church and considered an outlaw.

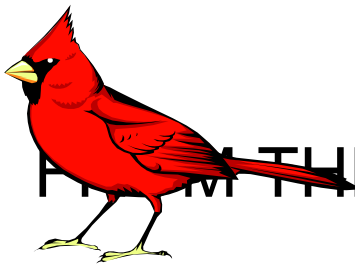
A group of friends kidnapped Luther and hid him in Wartburg Castle. While there Luther studied the Bible, translated part of the Bible into German (the language of the people), and wrote songs. Eventually he returned to Wittenberg and to preaching.

Although it wasn't Luther's intent to start a new church, Luther's work was the beginnings of the Lutheran Church. God used this ordinary person in an extraordinary way!
