We Are the Lord's

Grace and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ!

⁸ For if we live, we live to the Lord, and if we die, we die to the Lord. So then, whether we live or whether we die, we are the Lord's. ⁹ For to this end Christ died and lived again, that he might be Lord both of the dead and of the living (Romans 14:8-9).

Christianity is a matter of life and death and life again. In Christ, we are given the gift to live life to the full and then to lay life down again in confidence and hope that we will live again. We confess this each Sunday in our creeds: "I believe in the...resurrection of the body and the life everlasting" (Apostles' Creed) or "I look for the resurrection of the dead and the life of the world to come" (Nicen Creed).----

The Bible says that there is a time to live and a time to die (Ecclesiastes 3:2a). For some of the saints very recently, the time to die has come and gone. For the rest of us, the saints on earth, that chapter of our lives has yet to be written. We are reminded that our lives on this earth will be surpassed by eternity (2 Cor. 4:16-18). The best is yet to come. For Christ not only died, he came to life again so that he might be Lord of both the dead and the living. Everyone baptized into Christ Jesus is baptized into his death and resurrection (Romans 6:3-4). We can be confident that because we have shared in his death, we shall also share in his resurrection. That eternal truth and promise gives us Christians certainty in uncertain time.

On the Last Day, every grave will be opened, and those who have died in Christ will be raised to share in his glory. In their flesh they shall behold him and their eyes shall see him (Job 19:25-27). In his cross and death Jesus has destroyed death. By his rising to life again, he has broken the bonds of the grave and defeated death and hell. Each of the saints who have fallen asleep in Christ will be brought with him on the day when he returns to judge the living and the dead.

Someone once said that the church is the only organization that does not remove its members because they happen to be dead. Christ is Lord both of the dead and the living. By faith we have come to know that he is the very life of all who trust in him, whether here on earth or there in heaven. All baptized believers are at one in him.

Christianity is the faith by which we live and in which we shall die and then be raised. This is the faith that sustains us in our brightest days and our darkest nights. This is the faith worked in us by the Holy Spirit through the Gospel in Word and sacraments. God cleanses us by the water and the Word so that we live before God in righteousness and purity now and forever.

O Lord, the first and the last, the beginning and the end, as you were with us in birth, be with us through life, be with us in death and because your mercy will not leave us then, grant that we do not die without hope, but rise to life forever with you and in you, for you live and reign in the glory of the eternal Trinity, one God, now and forever. Amen.

Food Drives: This Holiday Season: St. John's Lutheran Church-Mayfair/Chicago, Holy Apostles Greek Orthodox Church-Westchester, Hillside Public Library. The extra food is a great help during Thanksgiving & Christmas.

Fundraising:

Fundraising for the Expansions Project, General Pantry Support, and Holiday Food Pantry are a never-ending activity. We will continue fundraising, especially for our Holiday Meal Giveaways. Right now, there are no added Holiday Giveaway Dates Scheduled because of lack of funding. Thanksgiving Food items will be given away during our regular Saturday pantry Dates in November & December with additional weekday distributions added, as usual.

Expansion Project Update:

\$14,848.84 has been spent on the deposits for the concrete and building, so far.

A special appeal has been made to the Village of Hillside zoning commission, waiting for the results. Hopefully I will have some good news in time for the Voters Meeting. In the meantime, fundraising will continue so we can complete the project as soon as possible. Main Issues: Foundation Stem Wall Requirement, Allowing Metal Building Structure, Village Support, and building usage limitations.

Total Project Budget: \$178,150 Minimum Project Budget: \$158,000 Increase due to Village requirements \$29,000 **NEW PROJECT BUDGET \$207,150** Funds/ Grants Collected to date \$55,000 (aprox.)

On Tuesday, Sept 19th the Mayor of Hillside agreed to approve the PYHT Expansion project by amending the village ordinances that were obstructing the building of our pantry. Faithful Stewards

By God's grace, we can acknowledge that "every good gift and every perfect gift is from above" (James 1:17), and we have been given the privilege and responsibility to manage all that He entrusts to us. In spite of our unworthiness, God has chosen us in Christ to become His stewards. 
