Climbing Higher

In a unique way, the author Max Lucado offers an interesting perspective regarding the life of Christians and the branches of a tree. According to his tree analogy, most Christians sit comfortably on low -lying thick branches. Life for Christians next to the trunk of the tree is steady and predictable. There are higher branches, but they appear risky and a lot less comfortable. In our humanity, we desire to stay where it is safe and easy. We become branch-sitters.

Again, considering the analogy of the tree, we can say that Jesus calls each of us to climb higher in our prayer life, in our worship, and in reading His Word. Are we looking for opportunities to climb higher in our serving, witnessing, and giving? As we climb, the branches will be thinner and less steady, but Christ will support us. The world tells us to stay put on our secure big branches, but the One who loves us is quietly nudging us to go higher. Jesus wants us to depend on and trust in Him. He promises that He will never leave us.

One climb that we may resist the most is in the area of giving. The average Christian household gives approximately 2.5 percent of their income to their church, so most of us are sitting securely on some rather low branches. Our heavenly Father wants us to climb higher in the area of our giving. "On the first day of every week, each of you is to put something aside and store it up, as he may prosper, so that there will be no collecting when I come" (1 Corinthians 16:2). We are to climb so that we regularly give a portion of our income. As we climb in our giving, we show our gratitude and thanksgiving for all of God's blessings. When we climb toward the branch that says "tithe" and go beyond that branch to the one marked "sacrificial giving," we will experience the joy Jesus referred to, saying, "It is more blessed to give than to receive" (Acts 20:35).

Our prayer is that the Holy Spirit will lead us to higher and higher branches. After all, God knows better than anyone the cost of hanging on a tree.


Stewardship Corner

When I was a child, I had a desire to go camping. I had several friends that would go to summer camp every year. They would come back to school and talk about how much fun they had. It wasn't until I got to college that I finally got to have my first camping experience. It was during the summer, and I went with some of the students who also worked on campus. We went tent-camping at Starved Rock State Park. I truly enjoyed it and have since been tent and cabin camping at various campsites in Michigan and Wisconsin.

Some of my greatest camping experiences, however, have been those where I have taken my students on Outdoor Education experiences. I have taken students to various camps in Michigan, Kentucky, Indiana, and Illinois. We've experienced rappelling, caving, high ropes, hiking, teambuilding, canoeing, archery, and a host of other activities. This month I will be embarking on my 25th Outdoor Education experience.

Over the years, I have developed a saying or a focus about the camp experience. The saying is, "It's a me thing, it's a we thing, it's a God thing." This saying is based on what I hope the students learn about as we plan, prepare, and actually experience at camp. It's also what I hope they carry with them after the experience.

"It's a me thing" is the focus on themselves as we work on their self-esteem and self-confidence. It is hoped that the students will learn more about themselves as they grow and learn to understand and appreciate just how special they are and all that they can be and do. "It's a we thing" is the focus on teambuilding, cooperative learning, and problem solving as a group. They learn to appreciate each other and how to work together.

The last and most important focus is, "It's a God thing." We work on building a stronger relationship to God. Being out in His creation is an amazing and special experience. We get to focus on our role as caretakers of that creation. We also focus on finding the God thing moments in their lives.

A God thing moment is something powerful that happens to them or to someone that they know. It's about God being present and active in their lives. It's the kind of thing that they can't do on their own. Sometimes those God thing moments are loud and sometimes they are very quiet. But either way, it's a blessing to them.

Being able to experience Outdoor Education and camping has truly been one of my favorite God thing moments for 25 years. May we all continue to experience God's blessings and many God thing moments in our lives.
