

The Great Exchange

Let's recall for a moment Jesus' encounter with the Rich Ruler. This young man came to Jesus asking how he could inherit eternal life. First Jesus threw the law at him: Don't commit adultery, don't murder, don't steal, don't give false testimony, honor your parents. Without hesitation, the young man asserted that he had kept these commandments all his life. Jesus said: "One thing you still lack. Sell all that you have and distribute to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, follow Me" (Luke 18:22). This the Rich Young Ruler could not do, for he loved his wealth more than anything else.

How different was Jesus' response when asked to give up the glories of Heaven for the lowliness of earth. Paul wrote in 2 Corinthians 8:9, "For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though He was rich, yet for your sakes He became poor, so that you by His poverty might become rich."

How have we become rich through the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ? What do we count as riches? Do we look at wealth the way the Rich Young Ruler did or through Christ's eyes?

Jesus was willing to give up His whole world in order that our souls could be saved. He gave His life in exchange for ours. We celebrate at this time of year His coming to earth as a helpless baby for the purpose of exchanging His life for our eternal lives.

In our prayers of thanks for the birth of the Christ Child, let us also ask Him to give us hearts of humility like His and the will to expend ourselves in lives of giving and serving in imitation of His life and death.


