Thank You God for Immanuel Lutheran Church

November is a month for giving thanks, therefore, let's thank God for the gift of His Church. On November 14th Immanuel Lutheran Church will celebrate its 165th Anniversary. Immanuel's history reaches back to the nineteenth century. Its founders came from Hanover, Germany around 1850, settled in Proviso Township, started a school in 1852, and formed a congregation in 1858. The rest is—as they say—history. More importantly, it is part of God's history, and within that history is God's mission of reaching out to others. God gave Immanuel a precious gift to fulfill that mission—the Gospel of Jesus Christ. That gift was shared primarily with German immigrants who joined the church and ultimately contributed to the life of the congregation. Over the decades demographic changes took place, changes that led Immanuel to refocus its outreach efforts.

Which brings us to November 14, 2023. Could the original founders have foreseen what God would be doing today at Immanuel? Probably not. The Church adapts to the changing landscape of the culture yet maintains the essential truths of Scripture. The message remains because "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever" (Hebrews 13:8). Today Immanuel is more ethnically diverse than ever. We give thanks to God for the founders of Immanuel. By the power of the Holy Spirit God used them to share Jesus with their neighbors. The focus now turns to Immanuel Lutheran Church in 2023. As we continue to minister within the walls our Church and Immanuel Christian Academy let us not forget those in our community who have not yet tasted the goodness of the Lord. They need Jesus just as much as we do. They are lost just as we once were. They need to be found just as we are found.

As we celebrate and thank God for preserving Immanuel let us also look forward and envision what our future will look like. The 21st century has brought many challenges. The culture does not respond to Christianity as it once did but let us not become discouraged. As stewards trusting in God's promises let us not only be hearers of God's Word but let us also be doers (James 1:22). Immanuel has deep roots in Hillside, roots originating from the Gospel. A true display of being rooted in the Gospel is when we bear fruit in our community. That's the key, refocusing our outreach efforts so that we can bear fruit in the community. Jesus said, "the Son of Man came not be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many" (Matt. 20:28). People who believe in the Gospel share the Gospel. People who've been forgiven share forgiveness, and those who've been restored work to see restoration in others. The people of Immanuel today are much like the people of Immanuel in 1858—we are called to fulfill the Great Commission by inviting all people to God's Banquet. The work is never easy. The challenges are always great. But by the power of the Holy Spirit and trusting His promises, God will use the love of Jesus overflowing in us to love those in our community.

Thank You, Lord, for 165 years of Immanuel Lutheran Church in Hillside. Thank You for using Your people to reach out to the community to bring others into Your Kingdom. And thank You in advance for what You have planned for us in the future. We trust You for all things. Amen.

Controlling Time


In his letter to the people in Ephesus, the Apostle Paul exhorts them: "Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise but as wise, making the best use of the time, because the days are evil" (Ephesians 5:15-16). With Hands – by folding our hands and praying to Him; pray with your hands; folding them together ready for prayer; we can rejoice and raise our hands in praise; by helping people just as He helps us; we can help people in need and show our kindness and mercy to them; by sitting down every day to pray for everything done in our lives; we can read the Bible and pray with people; we can help this world He made.

With Voices – Thank Him for all the things He does for us; sing with our voices to God; praying to Him, praising Him, thanking Him, talking to Hiim; we can sing songs of praise; by praying and singing His praises; we can sing praises to God in church and pray; we can glorify God and thank Him; by sharing the Word with others who don't believe in His name and Word; we can sing in a choir about His love and grace for us; we can praise Him; we can say kind things.

As I read through the things that my students had written, I was overcome with several emotions. Firstly, I felt encouraged by what we are able to do as a school and how our students are learning and growing in their faith. Secondly, I was just so moved by their thoughts. It was as if they had given me a Thanksgiving To-Do list or a checklist of things that I can do to thank God. I pray that as you read through their thoughts that you would be so encouraged to thank God with your hearts and hands and voices some of they ways they suggest. Blessings on your Thanksgiving.
