Sharing the Fruit of God's Love

Grace and peace to you in Jesus' name,

The Apostle Paul wrote, "Whoever sows sparingly will also reap sparingly, and whoever sows bountifully will also reap bountifully" (2 Corinthians 9:6). We will reap what we sow. If we sow kindness, we will reap kindness. If we sow discord and selfishness, that is what we will reap.

There is a parable told in India about the selfish man who inherited a rice field. The first year the man irrigated the field and it was fruitful. The water, in fact, flowed onto his neighbor's field and this too produced a bountiful harvest.

But the next year the selfish man reasoned: Why should I let this water flow through my field into his? Water is precious and I must keep it. So, he built a dam. This prevented the water from flowing into his neighbor's field but it proved disastrous to his own crop as well. Irrigation water nourished the field only if it flowed. When it did not move because of the dam, the water became stagnant and the field a swamp.

We own no rice fields. Still the parable is clear. Think of what we have inherited from God; think of all He has given us. If we are selfish, refusing to share, and keep it all for ourselves, our lives become stagnant, dismal swamps of mere existence. But if we give back to God by giving to others, both the giver and the receiver share in the fruits of God's love.

This is what Jesus did in his earthly ministry. Our Savior always put others first and by doing so, he revealed the love of the Father to fallen humanity. Think about your everyday interactions and the places you frequent, not just in church. Assess your surroundings and look for someone that you can share the love of God with.

As we close out the 2022-23 school year, I would like to that the faculty and staff of ICA for giving back to God for sharing the fruits of his love with students and parents and extended family. They have done so much throughout this past school year for the Lord. Be sure to thank our school staff and ministry for their commitment, patience, endurance, and selflessness for this past year of education at ICA.

Grants: Several new grants have been written to support our expansion project, fund general operations, pay for food purchases and transportation, purchase a delivery van, and for refugee food support.

Grant Writing Help: Thanks to Ron Siou, we were able to complete an extensive grant application to Chick-Fil-A Foundation, 42 uploaded documents, which included a 5-minute video pf PYHT operations. Expansion Project Update: Still waiting for permits from the Village of Hillside to start the concrete work. There is a delay due to zoning requirements. I have a meeting with the zoning official on Tuesday, May 30th. It's highly likely that we will not be able to open the pantry up to the public and must limit its use to storage and operations only. I am disappointed that Mayor Tamburino has not responded to any of our letters requesting support for our expansion project. Fundraising will continue until we meet our goal.

Hillside Public Library Support: Food & Fund Drive collections will continue throughout the Summer, beginning on June 12th.

\$14,848.84 has been spent on the deposits for the concrete and building, so far.



Community Garden Update

Spring has been busy! Those joyful growers, the weeds found our garden to be a favorable environment and made themselves at home. However, we needed our garden back! After much effort from all gardeners, the wild guests were tamed and the entire garden has been seeded with a civilized plants. Early this year, we start growing veggies indoors with great success. We started with lettuce and are now having the same success with peppers!

Some of you may know that we began the garden with bee hives on the large hill. There was a time when we had two bee keepers and three hives. One bee keeper

And we will offer some of our produce for sale as the harvest come in. Blessings on your Stewardship Journey

WE ARE STEWARDS!

Many individuals, groups, and organizations have defined stewardship in different meaningful ways over decades and generations. The following definition, out of possibly thousands, is focused on for this article because it captures the primary purpose of stewardship which is to use all that God entrusts to us for His purposes to care for both man and creation:

"A steward is more than a servant, slave, or trustee. A steward is one who, having received a trust from God, is in partnership with God through Christ for the working out of God's purposes for man and the world" (Joseph F. Jones).

To deepen our understanding of stewardship, we will expand on the meaning of a few key words in the above definition. God's Word tells us that one of the first responsibilities He gave Adam and Eve was to be His **stewards** (Genesis 1:26; 2:15). As stewards, they were to protect and take care of God's creation. Adam and Eve heard directly from God as to how they were to care for all that He had created out of nothing. As stewards today, we receive our direction from God's Word found in Scripture.

In this definition, the word <u>trust</u> is used to reference all the gifts and blessings that come from God's loving hands. The first stanza from the hymn "We Give Thee But Thine Own" helps us understand what is meant by trust. "We give thee but thine own, Whate'er the gift may be; For all we have is thine alone, A trust, O Lord, from Thee."

In Philippians 1:3-5, we find one of the three times that Scripture uses the word **partnership**. "I thank my God in all my remembrance of you, always in every prayer of mine for you all making my prayer with joy, because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now." God not only wants us to receive and believe His gospel, but He expects us to share the life-saving gospel with others.

In our stewardship definition, we are called to be about <u>God's purpos</u>es. 'God's Word is very clear about His purpose. In Luke 19:10 we read, "For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost." The Apostle Paul wrote, "This is good, and it is pleasing in the sight of God our Savior, Who desires all people to be saved and to come to the knowledge of the truth" (1 Timothy 2:3-4). God invites us to use our God-given time, talents, and money in ways that help others come to know and believe in Jesus.

God honors us with the privilege and responsibility to be His stewards. Through our faithful stewardship, God receives the honor and glory that He deserves.

"For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand, that we should walk in them" Ephesians 2:10

In his letter to the church in Corinth, the Apostle Paul wrote, "But as you excel in everything—in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in all earnestness and in our love for you-see that you excel in this act of grace also" (2 Corinthians 8:7). Paul is seeking the generosity of the people in Corinth for the distressed Christians in Jerusalem. He wants them, as he wants us, to excel in the grace of giving. With God's help through the indwelling work of the Holy Spirit, we know that "God is able to make all grace abound to [us], so that having all sufficiency in all things at all times, [we] may abound in every good work" (2 Corinthians 9:8).
